MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL VESTRY MEETING HELD ON SUNDAY 29TH APRIL 2018 AT HOLY CROSS PARISH CHURCH

A Celebration of the Holy Eucharist preceded the meeting.

Chairman's Welcome: The Rev'd Stephen Adams welcomed all present to the Twenty Fifth Annual Vestry Meeting of the Rectorial Benefice of Cowbridge. He also welcomed Dylan, Jude and Jim, students at St. Padarn's who were on placement in the parish.

The Rector then thanked the great number of people who work tirelessly to keep the life of the Parish growing, particularly the Clergy, Parish Wardens, Church Co-ordinators, Parish Treasurer, Parish Administrator, Church Treasurers, Musicians, Sunday School Teachers, Bell Ringers, Pastoral Visitors, Eucharistic Ministers, Servers, Flower Arrangers, Cleaners and so many people who give of their time, talents, and resources.

He then offered his thanks to Mr. R. Norey and Mr. D-L Jones for their unfailing work, most of which is unseen, but nonetheless essential to the smooth operation of the Parish. He continued by thanking the Parish Wardens, for their support over the previous year and made mention of Mr. David Crompton who retires as Parish Warden after more than a decade of loyal service.

He concluded that he was encouraged to see all that God is doing in all the Churches across the Benefice.

Attendance: there were forty-one attendees. Apologies for absence were noted, seven in all.

The Minutes of the Annual Vestry Meeting held on the 30th April 2017 having been circulated with the 2017 Parish Report, with the addition that Mrs. S. Sarjeant had been elected as a member of the PCC, were accepted on the proposition of Mr. Hunter Jarvie, seconded by Mr. John Williams, and signed by the Chairman as a true record.

Parochial Church Council Report and Financial Statements 2017: The annual report (pages 3-6) were accepted on the proposition of Mr. Hunter Jarvie, seconded by Mr. Geoff Cox.

Mrs. Leonie Hain asked a question regarding the amount of giving to mission the Parish makes. Mr. Ron Norey responded that the Parish had given £12,599 to mission in the previous financial year as per page 11, note 7 of the annual report. The Rector commented that in real terms all that the parish does is mission; the provision of three full time clergy; all that is spent of providing resources in terms of building; administrative support; governance; etc, enables the Parish to function to serve the people of the Benefice.

The Financial Statements for the year ending the 31st December 2017 were accepted on the proposition of Mr. Ron Norey, seconded by Mr. David Crompton.

The Chairman expressed thanks to Mr. Ron Norey and Mr. David-Lloyd Jones for all their hard work on behalf of the Parish.

The election of a Member of the Diocesan Conference.

Mrs. Marion Layton-Matthews was elected as the Parish representative to the Diocesan Conference.

The appointment of the Independent Examiner.

It was agreed, on the proposition of Mr. Ron Norey, seconded by Mr. Hunter Jarvie to confirm the appointment of Messrs. Adey, Fitzgerald and Walker as Independent Examiners to the Rectorial Benefice of Cowbridge for the financial year ending 31st December 2018.

The Rector expressed thanks to all Officers of the Parish and Members of the PCC who had served during the previous year for their work to sustain and strengthen the life and mission of the Parish.

Parish Review: The Rector introduced Mr. Gareth Williams who gave an overview of the proposed outcomes of the Parish Review Report – Growing Together Through Teamwork and its implementation action plan. All churches were encouraged to engage with this strategy and to take it forward.

Questions:

Mrs. Cathy Mangles asked what would be happening in regard of the outstanding works identified by the Quinquennial Inspections and who would be managing the process following the retirement of Mr. David Crompton. The Rector responded that Mr. Crompton would still be Chairman of the Benefice buildings committee and as such, available to advise church management committees as and when required.

Mrs. Pauline Lane asked for clarification as to the purpose of the Holy Cross Restoration Fund. The Rector responded that this was a restricted fund, the monies therein being available for the ongoing repair, restoration and enhancement (including internal re-ordering) of Holy Cross Parish Church.

Mrs. Sue Freeland asked if email communication could be made a priority. The Rector responded that whilst this was desirable, the new GDPR legislation, which was about to come into force, made the retention of personal data and its use problematic. This is something that the PCC are aware of and will progress. It is hoped that the introduction of Facebook and a new website will be a major step forward in the way the parish communicates.

ANNUAL REPORT AND FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2018

REFERENCE AND ADMINISTRATIVE DATA

The Rectorial Benefice of Cowbridge Parochial Church Council (PCC) is registered with the Charity Commission for England and Wales; registered number 1131497.

The Benefice parish is centred on the old market town of Cowbridge, in the Vale of Glamorgan Deanery, and is part of the Church in Wales Diocese of Llandaff. The twelve Churches which make up the Parish are:

- Holy Cross Parish Church, Cowbridge
- St. John the Baptist, Llanblethian
- St. Dochdwy, Llandough
- St. Hilary, St. Hilary
- St. Mary, St. Mary Church
- St. Michael and all Angels, Flemingston
- St. Senwyr, Llansannor
- St. John the Evangelist, Penllyn
- St. Owain, Ystradowen
- St. Brynach, Llanfrynach
- St. Canna, Llangan
- St. Mary, St Mary Hill

STRUCTURE GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Church in Wales is governed by its Constitution, set up under section 13(1) of the Welsh Church Acts 1914, as amended from time to time by its Governing Body. The PCC is not a body corporate. Its composition, procedure and powers are regulated by the Constitution. Before assuming office, every member of the PCC must sign a declaration that they will be bound by the Constitution, which provides that the members of the PCC shall be:

- The Incumbent, Vicars and Assistant Curates;
- A Church Warden for the whole Parish appointed by the Incumbent at the Annual Vestry Meeting (AVM);
- A Sub-Warden for each Church if appointed by the Incumbent at the AVM
- A Church Warden for the whole Parish elected at the AVM;
- A Sub-Warden for each Church if elected at the AVM;
- Up to 25 lay members elected at the AVM;
- Co-opted Secretary and Treasurer (if not already ex-officio or elected), plus up to 7 further co-opted members.

The constitution further provides that lay, communicant persons over the age of 16 may be entered on an Electoral Roll (subject to certain conditions) and that all such persons, so entered, are entitled to vote and to stand for election.

On 13th March 2017, The Rector and the PCC resolved

(1) To suspend the appointment of Sub-wardens for each of the Benefice Churches.

(2) That hereafter, each church congregational meeting shall nominate one person from the congregation of that church to be elected to The PCC at the Annual Vestry Meeting.

OBJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

The Church in Wales is a province within the Anglican Communion and seeks to advance the Christian religion through world-wide mission. Its calling is to nurture people in the faith of Jesus Christ and to aid them to grow in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, so that the good news of God's grace may be clearly proclaimed in the world and that God's Kingdom may be honoured and advanced.

Under the constitution, it is the the PCC's duty to:

- consult and co-operate with the incumbent in all matters of concern and importance to the Parish;
- promote the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical, in the Parish;
- be responsible for the parochial budget and all expenditure thereunder;
- care for and maintain church fabric and churchyards,
- act on any other matter referred to it in accordance with the Constitution;
- be the normal channel of communication between parishioners and the Diocesan Bishop.

The PCC is aware of the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and have had due regard to that guidance when exercising any powers or duties to which the guidance is relevant. The PCC believes that it provides a benefit to the public, by:

- fulfilling its duties detailed above;
- providing resources and facilities for public worship, pastoral care and spiritual, moral and intellectual development, both for its members and for anyone who wishes to benefit from what the Church offers;
- promoting Christian values, and service by members of the Churches in the Parish to their communities, to the benefit of individuals and society as a whole.

PCC PROCEEDINGS AND ACTIVITIES

General

The PCC met four times in 2018 to deal with all matters concerning the Parish and consider reports from sub-committees to whom some activities are delegated.

Membership and attendance

The Electoral Roll, reported to the PCC on 25th March 2019 shows 264 parishioners currently on the roll (2018: 261, 2017: 263). Communicants at Easter and Christmas in 2018 were 337 and 333 respectively. Average adult weekly attendance during 2018, calculated in accordance with Diocesan guidelines was 171.8 (2017:178.2)

PCC FINANCES: UNRESTRICTED FUNDS

Summary for 2018: Income and expenditure are detailed in the Statement of Financial Activities (page 8) and in the notes thereto. Total unrestricted income was £186,390, (compared with income of £192,658 in 2017).

Parish Share (primarily to fund clergy stipends and oncosts eg. NI, pension, housing, supervision, etc, which provides our main mission resource) continues to be the major Parish expense (£85,933) included in total unrestricted expenditure of £177,444 (2017: £168,238).

The decreased income less increased costs provides a decreased surplus of £9,746 (after transfers from the St Mary Hill 100 club to cover the local deficit), compared with a deficit budget of -£8,611. There was also a net loss on revaluation of investments of £2,980, making a total surplus for the year of £6,766.

Reserves policy and future prospects:

After adding the surplus for the year, the unrestricted fund balance to carry forward is £344,692, of which £144,043 represents tangible fixed assets, leaving £200,649 as free reserves (2017: £193,092).

The PCC reserve policy is to retain a balance of unrestricted "free" reserves, as working capital and to meet future shortfalls in income or unexpected expense, equal to at least six months expenditure. Clearly the balance detailed above represents considerably more than this target, but the PCC have concerns, which dictate continuing caution.

- The PCC approved a budget for 2019 which shows a deficit of £9,831 (see page 15).
- The budget includes fund-raising provision, but the church communities report increasing difficulty to meet the targets, and there are increasing calls to raise funds for quinquennial repairs.
- A recent review of Parish administration, recognised the need for "succession" in some key particularly regard of in financial areas, administration. An application to the Diocesan Transformation Fund was successful with funding secured for three years for the employment of a finance assistant. The Parish has been fortune to engage Mrs. Carole Bird, a Chartered Account for this position. It should be noted that the Parish will take on responsibility for the cost of this role once grant funding is exhausted.
- The Parish quinquennial repair liabilities are enormous (see church fabric below) yet external fund resources become increasingly difficult to obtain. The PCC will therefore be obliged to meet an increasing proportion of such repair costs from its own funds.

PCC FINANCES: DESIGNATED FUNDS

The proceeds from disposal of Llanfair Hall were set aside to fund extraordinary repairs and improvements to Parish churches. £800 in interest has been added to the fund in the financial period. The balance carried forward being £173,318 to fund further such extraordinary expenditure in the Parish, including quinquennial repairs.

The Llanblethian Church Hall fund is for the running and maintenance of the hall by a delegated Hall Management Committee. The fund shows a surplus £1,695 for the year and a balance to carry forward of £16,975. Significant work to replace the floor of the hall took place in 2018, the cost of which was covered by grants and fund raising activities. The Church Hall management committee are to be congratulated for their handwork and dedication.

Llanblethian Church is a beneficiary of the Evan Jenkins Trust to fund repairs to the church up to certain limits imposed by its trust deed. However there are exclusions including new equipment and facilities. The unexpected fees for filming at Llanblethian have been set aside to deal with those quinquennial repair and improvement costs which may not be covered by the Evan Jenkins Trust; the balance carried forward is £9,650.

No decisions have yet been made with regard to the use of the Parish mission fund; the balance carried forward is $\pounds19,041$.

PCC FINANCES: RESTRICTED FUNDS

Income and expenditure totals are shown in the Statement of Financial Activities on page 8 and in the accompanying notes; the movements on and details of each of the major funds is shown in note 19 to the Financial Statements. Charity law provides that the restricted fund balances carried forward may only be expended upon the purpose for which the funds were given.

RISK ASSESSMENT

The PCC has reviewed the risks to its operations and is satisfied that they are mitigated in so far as the PCC has power to do so. The major risks are assessed as:

- Compliance with complex UK law relative to premises and activities;
- Maintenance of listed Parish churches and properties, which are expensive to repair;
- Provision of leadership to maintain ministry and service to the community in the light of the PCC policy to maintain all the churches in the Parish and the limited capacity of its clergy.
- Increasing demands re legal, financial and administrative matters which exceed volunteer capacity.
- Budget control of expenditure and adequacy of financial systems.
- The ability to maintain income sufficient to match increasing costs.

FUND INVESTMENT AND ADEQUACY

Restricted and designated fund balances are largely represented by on-demand deposits and current account bank balances. Free unrestricted reserves are represented by similar deposit and bank balances, plus investments, the latter being approximately equal to 36% of free unrestricted reserves at year end. The net yield on the listed investments (including loss on revaluation (in 2018 was -2% (based upon the end year value). The investments are described in note 12 to the Financial Statements.

CHURCH FABRIC

Holy Cross re-ordering plans have moved forward to the extent that decisions have been taken on the removal of the remining pews and work is in hand on progressing those works. Minor repairs have been carried out on the south east wall of the Llanquian aisle. Repairs have been carried out to the ceiling at Llansanor church and the church re-opened for general use. Urgent repairs at Flemingston as detailed in the Quinquennial report has been completed. Preliminary work to resolve the problems of the ringing chamber floor at St Mary Church have been carried out. A Heritage Lottery grant for works to St Hilary tower was unsuccessful. The position with regard to works detailed in the Quinquennial reports is unchanged from last year. None of the works has been carried out due to lack of funding.

The current position is detailed below (the figures are taken from the latest QI):

- Llanblethian Church. £64,000 required. Minor works carried out.
- St Mary Church. £180,000 preliminary work has indicated a cost of £28,000 to deal with water ingress to the tower and ringing chamber. Quotes have been received for this work and funding is being investigated.
- St Hilary. £150,000. Initial safety work to secure the tower copings has been carried out. £30,000 potentially available from Garfield Weston Fund subject to confirmation of the remaining match funding being identified.
- Holy Cross £50,000 excluding work on re-ordering and pew removal.
- Flemingston £19,000 but mainly intermediate time scale.
- Llansannor church. £19,000 remaining QI works, ceiling repairs have been carried out.
- Llandough church is investigating the provision of a kitchen and toilet in the church which will require a faculty application in due course..

The PCC and Standing Committee have decided that churches need additional help and support in completing works required in the Quinquennial Inspections. The Benefice may need to make money available from Parish reserves rather than leaving the full costs to found by individual churches. The priority in this respect is work to St Hilary tower.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINERS REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL

I report on the Financial Statements of the Rectorial Benefice of Cowbridge for the year ended 31st December 2018, which are set out on pages 8 to 14.

RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL AND EXAMINER

As the Parochial Church Council, you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. You consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 ("the Charities Act") and that an independent examination is needed. The charity's gross income did not exceed £250,000 and I am qualified to undertake the examination by being a qualified member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the Charities Act,
- to follow the procedures laid down in the general Directions given by the Charity Commission (under section 145(5) (b) of the Charities Act, and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention

BASIS OF INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S STATEMENT

My examination was carried out in accordance with general Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair' view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S STATEMENT

In connection with my examination, no material matters have come to my attention which gives me cause to believe that in, any material respect:

- the accounting records were not kept in accordance with section 130 of the Charities Act; or
- · the accounts did not accord with the accounting records; or
- the accounts did not comply with the applicable requirements concerning the form and content of accounts set out in the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 other than any requirement that the accounts give a 'true and fair' view which is not a matter considered as part of an independent examination.

I have come across no other matters in connection with the examination to which attention should be drawn in this report in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

1. Accounting policies

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements, are as follows

a. Basis of preparation

The Rectorial Benefice of Cowbridge Parochial Church Council is a charity registered with the Charity Commision for England and Wales (Reg. No. 1131497) and is a Public Benefit Entity within the meaning of the accounting standard FRS102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities Act 2011, the Church In Wales Accounting Regulations, the applicable accounting standard (FRS102) and the Charities SORP based thereon, except as may be detailed in the following notes.

b. Preparation of Financial Statements on a going concern basis

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) has no reason to believe that the Parish will not remain a going concern for the foreseeable future and the Financial Statements have been prepared on this basis.

c. Funds accounting

Unrestricted funds are available to spend on activities that further any of the purposes of the Parish. Designated funds are unrestricted funds of the Parish which the PCC has decided at their discretion to set aside for a specific purpose. Restricted funds are donations given by the donor, or invited by the PCC, for a specific purpose, and may only be expended on those purposes; unspent balances must be carried forward and only spent on those specific purposes.

d. Income is accounted for gross.

Income is generally recognised when the PCC is entitled to the funds, there is sufficient certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured reliably. Planned giving, collections and donations are recognised when received. Tax refunds are recognised as soon as the amounts are claimable. Dividends are accounted for when receivable; interest is accrued. Where the PCC has not invested separately for each fund, interest is apportioned to individual funds on an average balance basis.

e. Expenditure is accounted for gross.

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make payment, it is probable that a payment will be made and the amount can be measured reliably. Parish Share is paid regularly and is included in expenditure for the year to which it relates. Unrestricted fund grants (including donations to missions) are recognised when determined by the PCC. Amounts received specifically for missions are dealt with as restricted funds and the liability for payment is recognised when the amounts are received.

f. Churches Churchyards and Vicarages are vested in the Representative Body of the Church in Wales, and are not Parish assets . Moveable Church contents (plate, furniture, etc) are inalienable property and require a faculty for disposal. They are recorded in the Church Terrier log. Many are historic for which no reliable cost basis exists. They are not recognised in the Balance Sheet. Expenditure on Churches (including contents), Churchyards and Vicarages is written off when incurred.

g. Property and investments held by the Representative Body of the Church in Wales

The Representative Body of the Church in Wales (RB) hold freehold property and investments on behalf of the PCC in trust, which provides that upon disposal, the proceeds may be applied by the PCC for charitable church purposes. Since the Parish is economically responsible for the properties and is solely concerned with the risks and rewards that relate both to the properties and the investments, it is the PCC view that the accounting principle of substance over form should be applied and that the properties and investments should be included in the Balance Sheet.

h. Freehold Property

All freehold property with the exception of Llansannor Hall is held by the Representative Body of the Church in Wales (RB) on trust as described above. The freehold of Llansannor Hall is held by the Llandaff Diocesan Board of Finance. The bases for the valuation of freehold property is shown in note 11. Routine additions and replacements to Church Hall contents are charged to current expenditure. Except for the dimunition in value of the land at Ystradowen (see note 11), no provision is made for depreciation of freehold property on the basis that with the possible exception of Leoline Close, the amounts included in the balance sheet probably represent no more than the value of the land, so no depreciation charge is appropriate. For Leoline Close, the excess of cost over the probabable value of the land, is such that any resultant depreciation charge spread over the economic life of the property is immaterial.

- i. Office and other Equipment is stated at cost and written off by depreciation over four years.
- j. Investment assets are stated at mid-market values on the balance sheet date and are detailed in note 12.
- k. Stocks are measured at the lower of cost or market value.

No reliable cost information exists for Llanblethian Hall or the freehold interest in Llansannor Hall. In accordance with accounting standard FRS102, they are included at "deemed historical cost" being the values existing at the time the accounting standard FRS102 was first applied to the Rectorial Benefice of Cowbridge Parochial Church Council financial statements.

The Llansannor Church Hall site is leased for 20 years to the Llansannor Community Hall Association, who have built a hall on the site. The Church retains exclusive use of the hall on Sundays and for one evening per week. The PCC cannot dispose of the freehold without Diocesan consent, and the reservation of time for use by the church, together with its use as a community hall with similar purposes to those of a church hall, suggest that its use in connection with church purposes has not changed.

The land at Ystradowen was consecrated as an extension to the Churchyard during 2011; as such it has no value for the PCC and full provision for diminution in value has been made.

Filming fees from previous years at Llanblethian church produced unexpected income; the PCC has determined to set these fees aside to finance improvements to the church not covered by the Evan Jenkins Charity.

The Parish mission fund represents funds originally thought to be intended for a Church Army Evangelist, but which upon confirmation that they were not so restricted, were set aside to fund major mission and outreach in the Parish.

The proceeds from the disposal of Llanfair hall have been set aside as a designated fund to meet extraordinary costs of repair and improvement of the church buildings in the Parish, all of which are listed buildings and some of which require urgent repair following guinguennial inspection.

21. TRUST FUNDS

The Rectorial Benefice of Cowbridge has become the successor sole beneficiary of trusts in respect of which the Representative Body of the Church in Wales are the trustees. Income, which is received regularly and automatically from a number of these trusts was immaterial. For others, application has to be made for payments out of accumulated income to match expenditure incurred on those items covered by the purposes of the trusts. In 2018 the PCC made no such application.
